

ENT Department at GBCM is reflecting a strong commitment to academic excellence, clinical proficiency, and student-centered learning. The department has successfully implemented the Competency-Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum, incorporating structured logbooks, Direct Observation of Procedural Skills (DOPS), and formative assessments for MBBS batches from 2021 to 2024. Faculty members have demonstrated academic leadership by serving as external examiners, guest speakers, and coordinators of value-added programs like Rashtra Bodh.

Clinically, the department has expanded its surgical portfolio, performing advanced procedures such as Functional Endoscopic Sinus Surgery (FESS), tympanoplasty, mastoidectomy, thyroidectomy, and salivary gland surgeries, while adopting modern techniques like coblation for bloodless procedures. Community outreach initiatives, including free ENT screening camps, have contributed to early detection of head and neck cancers and hearing disorders, thereby enhancing public health impact.

Student training is a major focus, with hands-on skill lab sessions, AETCOM module integration, and structured elective postings aligned with NMC guidelines. These electives emphasize procedural skills, research involvement, and case-based discussions, ensuring students are well-prepared for clinical practice. Infrastructure has also been upgraded with advanced diagnostic tools such as video endoscopy, Audiometry facilities, and BERA.
